Call for Trainees

We are pleased to invite you for a European COST training school on "Using *Keystroke Logging in Writing Research*", to be held in Antwerp (Belgium) from 16 to 18 March 2016.

The main objective is to bring together a group of international PhD students & post-doc researchers and introduce them to the current methods of collecting and analyzing writing process data. The primary focus will be on the use of keystroke logging (Inputlog and Scriptlog).

By bringing together experts and junior researchers, we hope to support and further stimulate process related research in the domain of writing.

The ELN COST Action offers a grant for 10 trainees (young researchers). A competitive selection will be in place.



WRITING PROCESS RESEARCH 2016:

Keystroke Logging

Aims

It is our intention to gather a small group of about 20 to 25 junior researchers in the domain of writing process research. The main objectives of this symposium include the following:

- ▶ explore the possibilities and limitations of new methods and techniques that are currently used to collect data on writing processes, viz. keystroke logging;
- ▶ discuss good practices to set up ethnographical and experimental writing process research, also focusing on the complementarity of observation methods;
- ▶ introduce a wide range of possibilities to explore writing process data from different perspectives and prepare them for further analysis;
- ▶ present qualitative and quantitative approaches to writing process data;
- ▶ create a basis for a stronger international network of enthusiast writing researchers in different stages in their careers.

Where

The symposium is organized at the University of Antwerp (City Campus). This campus is situated in the historical city centre and its central 16th century building "Hof van Liere", is part of the cultural-historical patrimony of Antwerp.

Who

A maximum of 25 trainees will be accepted.

- ▶ PhD students
- ▶ Post docs + maximum 10 years
- ▶ long-life learning possible

Cost

The registration fees are € 225, which includes lunches, coffee breaks and three days of courses.

Grant Opportunity

The ELN COST Action offers **10 grants of € 450** in order to support the travel and accommodation of ten trainees. Selection of participants will be made on the basis of the submitted information and the statement of how attending the symposium will benefit the participant and their home research group.

Note: According to the COST policy promoting European networking (mobility and exchanges), a trainee cannot apply for a grant for a symposium occurring in her/his own country.
